





 International and inter-sector transfer of knowledge and sharing of ideas and of R&I culture



 Common research and innovation project as the basis of collaboration

What?

Support is provided for the development of partnerships in the form of joint research and innovation activities between the participants implemented through secondments of research and innovation staff ("exchanges").

RISE - Research and Innovation Staff Exchange

- Beneficiary: only legal entities that are established in EU MS or AC, signs the Grant Agreement
 AC count towards the minimum number of participants
- Eligible staff early-stage researchers, experienced researchers, administrative, managerial and technical staff of any nationality supporting the research and innovation activities of the project
- Staff member at least 6 months at the sending institution before first secondment
- Secondments from 1 to 12 months, followed by reintegration into the sending institution
- Staff member unit cost is a top-up allowance, not subject to country correction coefficient
- EU contribution maximum 540 person-months

RISE – Eligibility Conditions

- At least 3 independent participants in 3 different countries
- At least 2 participants from 2 different MS/AC
- If all in MS/AC: at least 1 academic and 1 non-academic

The specific challenge:


networking gaps and deficiencies between the research institutions of the Widening countries and internationally-leading counterparts at EU level.

Aim:

Strengthening a defined field of research in a university or research organization from a Widening country by linking it with **at least 2 internationallyleading research institutions** in other Member States or Associated Countries.

Enhance the S&T capacity of the linked institutions;

Help raise the research profile of the institution from the Widening country as well as the research profile of its staff.



Forthcoming call

Successful Twinning proposals:

Clearly outlined the <u>scientific strategy</u> for stepping up and stimulating scientific excellence and innovation capacity in a defined area of research as well as the scientific quality of the partners involved in the twinning exercise.

Strategy measures:

- short term staff exchanges;
- expert visits and short-term on-site or virtual training; workshops;
- conference attendance;
- organisation of joint summer school type activities;
- dissemination and outreach activities.

Costs relating to administration, networking, coordination, training, management, travel costs are **acceptable**. **Ineligible Cost categories**: infrastructure costs; equipment; research costs (including consumables).

Before starting partner search, prepare answers to the following 5 questions:

Q1: Why bother? (What problem are your trying to solve?)

Q2: Why is this important at EU level? (EU policy papers, strategic documents, white & green papers, strategic document of other key International organizations)

Q3: Is there already a product or service available?

Q4: Why now? (What would happen if this project was not funded?)

Q5: Why you? (Are you the best consortium to undertake this research).
